Report to Stakeholders 2022-2023 Academic Year

The Educational Leadership and Policy Studies (ELPS) program continually reviews courses and programs through Program Assessment at Wayne State University. Our mission is to prepare educational leaders who are reflective, innovative professionals who will affirm and demonstrate their commitment to equitable and just education. To realize our mission, we teach theories, methodologies, and concepts related to justice and equity through interactive, relational, and culturally relevant pedagogies. We support students with integrating those ideas into practice and encourage continuous learning and improvement orientation to school leader practice.

To review our progress, we assess coursework and clinical experiences for evidence of commitment to equity and justice. Data are collected from assignments completed in our courses and determine if learning outcomes are met. After reviewing data from the assignments, it indicates the ELPS program meets the criteria required for the learning outcomes in areas. This year, we implemented a new course, EDA 7730 Intersectional Issues in Educational Leadership, to better meet the requirements of Learning Outcome 3 in Equity, Inclusiveness, and Cultural Responsiveness. We have updated our learning outcomes and assignments in the Master of Education and Education Specialist Certificate programs with new standards implemented by the Michigan Department of Education.

Learning Outcomes for the Master of Education in Educational Leadership and the Education Specialist Certificate in Administration and Supervision:

- 1. **Mission, Vision, & Improvement**: The student will collaboratively lead, design, and implement a school mission, vision, and process for continuous improvement that reflects a core set of values and priorities that include data use, technology,
- 2. **Ethics and Professional Norms**: The student will understand and demonstrate the capacity to advocate for ethical decisions and cultivate and enact professional norms.
- 3. **Equity, Inclusiveness, and Cultural Responsiveness**: The student will develop and maintain a supportive, equitable, culturally responsive, and inclusive school culture.
- 4. **Learning and Instruction**: The student will create a school instructional program including equity of educational opportunity for student growth and learning as an instructional leader.
- 5. **Community and External Leadership**: The student will engage families, community, and school personnel in order to strengthen student learning, support school improvement, and advocate for the needs of their school and community.

- 6. **Operations and Management**: The student will Improve management, communication, technology, school-level governance, and operation systems to develop and improve data-informed and equitable school resource plans.
- 7. **Building Professional Capacity**: The student will engage staff in the development of a collaborative professional culture and improve systems of staff supervision, evaluation, support, and professional learning.
