The **Bachelor of Science/Arts in Education** with a major in Special Education leads to a Michigan Elementary Standard Teaching Certificate for teaching all subjects in grades K-5; and all subjects in grades K-8 in a self-contained classroom. In addition students will earn a certification in Cognitive Impairment in grades K-12. The program consists of University General Education Requirements, College Requirements, the Professional Education Sequence and the Cognitive Impairment Major.
