

# ADVISING GUIDE Community Health

The **Bachelor of Science** with a major in Community Health is for students who would like a career as a practitioner of community health or who would like to pursue graduate studies in this area. This curriculum is specifically designed to prepare students for to take the Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES) exam, and ensures that students are trained and qualified to plan and coordinate health education programs.



The Community Health program requires 15 credit hours of approved electives. Not more than three classes will be considered per subject area (i.e., PH, PSY, NFS, SOC, etc.) Other approved program electives come from a variety of areas and can even be used to add a university minor.
